To Ponder:

In the weeks after Easter, I find myself thinking about the apostles, those who Jesus once characterized as “ye of little faith.” I think about the appearances of Jesus after the resurrection and the necessity of “seeing” in order to “believe.” I am in awe of the transformation the followers of Jesus experienced and grateful for the gift of faith passed down to us through the ages.

What moved them into action? What grace did they receive? The Gospels describe Pentecost and the coming of the Holy Spirit in flames of fire. To be moved by the Spirit is indeed at the heart of Christian spirituality. Contemporary culture gives us another picture of the resolve which freed the early community and ours today as we strive to be the “followers of Jesus” and “witnesses to the Resurrection.”

Victor Frankl during his stay at Auschwitz offers us this advice: “Don’t aim for success – the more you aim at it and make it a target, the more you are going to miss it. For success, like happiness, cannot be pursued; it must ensue, and it only does so as the unintended side-effect of one’s personal dedication to a cause greater than oneself, or as the by-product of surrender to a person other than oneself. I want you to listen to what your conscience commands you to do and carry it out with the best of your knowledge. Then you may live to see that in the long run – in the long run, I say! – success will follow you precisely because you have forgotten to think about it.” Man’s Search for Meaning cited in John Neafsey’s A Sacred Voice is Calling
