The Son of God comes close Where people praise his name, Where bread and wine are blest And shared, as when he came: The Son of God is here to stay Embracing those who walk his way.



God's goal is always union, which is very different from any private perfection (which is merely a goal of the small ego).

Life lived fully and honestly inevitably involves both joy and suffering, a path of descent, doubt, and lots of little deaths that teach us to let go of our artificially created self and to live in the simple joy of divine union—and *voilá*, the True Self stands revealed, fully present and accounted for.

Our carefully constructed ego container must gradually crack open, as we realize that we are not separate from God, from others, or from our true selves. ...

We are never perfectly whole, but the acceptance of that lack of wholeness is precisely what we mean by holiness, or accepting the "whole" of reality. When we are capable of non-dualistic thinking (contemplation), we can even forgive and accept our imperfections and those of all the world.

Divine perfection is precisely the ability to include and forgive all imperfection.
