A Spring Within Us by Richard Rohr

To have a spiritual life is to recognize early on that there is always a similarity between the seer and the seen. You will seek only what you have already partially discovered and therefore desire. God plants the desire in us...When you honor and accept the Divine Image within yourself, you henceforth can't help but to see it in everybody else too--and you know that it is just as underserved and unmerited in them as it is in you. That is almost the only way you can stop judging, and that is how you start loving unconditionally and without asking whether someone is worthy or not.

Spirituality is always about you changing your own way of seeing and your own way of hearing (not changing other people!). It's about opening your heart space every day and keeping it open with some form of prayer, every few minutes if need be, so that the hurts and disappointments of life won't close you down. You have to find some practice, some ritual, some silence, or whatever it is that helps you recognize how God is trying to be with you, as well as how you may be closing down. What you seek is surely what you will get. We mend and renew the world by strengthening inside ourselves what we seek outside ourselves, and not by demanding it of others or trying to force it on others
